Impact Assessment: Cathedral Primary School, Bristol

- 1. Section 9 of the Academies Act 2010 (later as amended by the Education Act 2011) places a duty on the Secretary of State to take into account what the impact of establishing the institution would likely be on maintained schools, academies, institutions within the further education sector and alternative provision in the area in which the institution is (or is proposed to be) situated. Any adverse impact will need to be balanced against the benefits of establishing the new school.
- 2. We have carried out an impact assessment (see the table 1 below) which concludes that the impact of Cathedral Primary School on local schools is minimal. Our analysis is set out in the following context:
 - There is severe basic need in the area with a predicted pupil population increase of 30.7% between 2011/12 and 2016/17.
 - The nearest school, St George Church of England Primary School (0.2 miles from Cathedral Primary School) is a 0.5FE school and is due to close in 2013, because the local authority views its small size as unsustainable. The decision to close the school is unrelated to the proposed free school.
 - The closure of St George CofE Primary School, coupled with severe basic need will mitigate the potential of the free school having a moderate impact on Compass Point South Street School.
 - The oversubscription criteria published by Cathedral Primary School draws in pupils from across Bristol as well as a small number from North Somerset, South Gloucestershire and further afield through the random allocation of pupil places, so the impact on any one school or area will be minimised.
- 3. Bristol City Council, who enjoy an excellent working relationship with the sponsor, Bristol Cathedral School, wrote to the Department in support of the Cathedral Primary School proposal. The local authority, who predict a shortfall in the area equivalent to 2 forms of entry in the short to medium term, stated that admissions arrangements which give a higher preference to local children would be preferable. However, it recognises and supports the unique offer of the free school. Bristol City Council therefore concludes that Cathedral Primary School would have a minimal impact on local schools.
- 4. South Gloucestershire Council also wrote to the Department in support of Cathedral Primary School, citing a shortage of primary places across the area as a whole.
- 5. Our assessment concludes that Cathedral Primary School will have a minimal overall impact on the surrounding schools and that it is appropriate for the Secretary of State to enter into a funding agreement with the trust on the basis that:
 - Cathedral Primary School will be likely to contribute to improved standards in the area.
 - Cathedral Primary School will work towards meeting the need for primary places across the local and wider area.
 - Cathedral Primary School will give parents greater choice and will offer something different to existing schools in the area.
