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Introduction to the funding allocation pack 2014 to 2015

This operational guide is to help you understand how your academic year (AY) 2014 to 2015 funding has been calculated by the Education Funding Agency (EFA).

The guide supports your AY 2014 to 2015 general annual grant (GAG) statement. Your GAG statement sets out the funding you will receive, how it has been calculated and where the data is from. It covers the period from when you opened/converted to academy status up to the end of the academic year, which is 31 August 2015. The number of days for which you are funded can be found at the top of each page of your funding allocation pack.

The guide has been produced in a format which enables you to easily access the specific parts that interest you, or areas where you require more detailed information.

Your pupil premium allocation is paid outside of the GAG and is therefore not included in your AY 2014 to 2015 funding allocation.

This guide is intended for special and alternative provision (AP) free schools which open during the period 1 September 2014 to 31 March 2015. Further information about revenue funding for all types of free schools can be found here.

Post-16 allocations

Section 3 of the summary table refers to the post-16 statement sent to alternative provision free schools and those special free schools who have non-statemented post-16 students. Special free schools with post-16 provision (statemented pupils) are funded for pre and post-16 provision on the same place-funded basis and do not receive a separate statement. Introduction to high needs block

From 2013 local authorities have had an enhanced role in funding high needs pupils in academies and free schools, as a commissioner of education provision for these pupils. This means that academies and free schools now receive funding from both the EFA (place funding) and local authorities (top-up funding) for pupils with high needs. Sometimes the top-up funding comes directly from schools, where they commission alternative provision (AP) places directly.

Special free schools receive £10,000 per place for each SEN place; alternative provision free schools receive £8,000 for each AP place.

Top-up funding above these levels, based on the assessed needs of the pupil and the cost of meeting their needs in the setting, should be agreed between the commissioning local authority and the free school. Top-up funding is paid on a <u>per-pupil basis</u>, for the period that the pupil is actually occupying the place in the free school. It is paid directly on a monthly basis unless a different payment frequency is agreed with the local authority. Top-up funding for pupils in AP can be paid directly by other academies and schools if they commission the places for those pupils. The top-up element is not included in this allocation.

Introduction to Education Services Grant

Local Authority Central Spend Equivalent Grant (LACSEG) ended as part of the AY 2014 to 2015 funding reforms and was replaced by the Education Services Grant (ESG). This grant is payable to academies and free schools as they are responsible for a range of education services – such as school improvement, audit and asset management – that local authorities perform on behalf of maintained schools. The ESG is allocated on a simple per-place basis to local authorities, academies and free schools according to the number of places for which they are responsible.

For AY 2014 to 2015, each academy/free school will receive:

- £140 per pupil (mainstream provision)
- £525 per Alternative Provision place
- £595 per SEN place

For alternative provision and special free schools the allocation will be based on planned places data.

Post-opening grant (POG)

The post-opening grant is for special and alternative provision free schools that meet the eligibility criteria. It is funding in addition to the per-pupil funding to reflect the additional essential costs of establishing a brand new school. The post-opening grant is paid in two parts: the per-pupil non-staffing resources element, to cover items such as buying books and equipment; and the leadership element, to meet the costs of employing key staff as the school builds up its cohorts over time. Further information about the post-opening grant for special and alternative provision free schools can be found in the relevant funding guide.
