## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 REQUEST REF: 0927-14

Thank you for your letter of 2 October asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

"On how many occasions have the British Government sought assurances from Algeria under the Deportation with Assurances (DWA) scheme in each of the past 4 years or such lesser period as falls within S.12 of the FOI Act in respect of non-extradition cases i.e. deportation cases. What was the period from initial approach to the conclusion in each case."

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.

I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold information relevant to your request.

The Foreign & Commonwealth Office has sought assurances from the Algerian Government on one occasion in the last four years, under the DWA policy. The Algerian Government provided the requested assurance in less than one week.
