

Addendum to ACMD's report on the synthetic opiate AH-7921

On 10th June 2014 the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs (ACMD) provided advice to the Minister for Crime Prevention in relation to the control of the synthetic opiate most commonly known as AH-7921.

The ACMD would like to propose a clarification to its recommendation in this report to include the systematic International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry (IUPAC) name used in the report in the revised recommendation.

This revision does not impact on the ACMD advice in terms of classification under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 or scheduling under the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 2001 (as amended).

Revised recommendation

The ACMD recommends that 3,4-dichloro-*N*-[[1-(dimethylamino)cyclohexyl]methyl]benzamide (AH-7921) be controlled under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971- specifically named as a Class A substance and scheduled under Schedule 1 of the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 2001 (as amended).
