You asked how much CLA vaccine was imported into the UK in each of the last 5 years.

Our Reply

The total quantity of Glanvac (includes Glanvac 6, Glanvac 3) imported under Special Treatment Certificate by fiscal year was:

1 April 2009 – 31 March 2010: 21,050 millilitres
1 April 2010 – 31 March 2011: 25,050 millilitres
1 April 2011 – 31 March 2012: 22,450 millilitres
1 April 2012 – 31 March 2013: 21,950 millilitres
1 April 2013 – 31 March 2013: 26,100 millilitres
1 April 2014 – 22 December 2014: 30,600 millilitres.
