Further to our email dated 4 June 2014, I am writing to provide you with a substantive response to your FOI request dated 22 May, in which you requested the following:

'I wonder whether I can ask for your help, in obtaining clearer reproductions of two of the pages of an AWRE pdf document that you kindly sent me on 14/2/2013? The document in question was the illustrated brochure: Digital Computing Facilities, dated December 1966. On the front cover of this document is a label with (I guess) your internal catalogue number: AW2015/43 02419. The images in the pdf document are rather indistinct.

I would be most grateful for a better-quality scan (preferably in jpg format or equivalent) of the two photographs on page 3 and the diagrammatic layout on page 10. If there is any reproduction charge involved then I would be happy to pay.

The reason for requesting the photos is in connection with a computer history article that I'm writing. The result will join similar research articles on the Ferrranti Atlas computer on this website:

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence and I can confirm that all the information in scope of your request is held

The information you have requested can be found enclosed, however some of it falls entirely within the scope of the absolute exemption provided for at section 40 (Personal Information) of the FOI Act and has been redacted. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and, as such, there is no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold this information.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
