The Freedom of Information Act 2000 requires every public authority to adopt and maintain a Publication Scheme. A Publication Scheme commits an authority to proactively publish or otherwise make available, as a matter of routine, certain information (including environmental information) which is held by the authority and falls within classifications set out by the Information Commissioner. The aim of the Publication Scheme is to provide the public with a single point of reference for information which the ODA has made available to the public.

From 1 July 2014 information previously held by the ODA has been held by the Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) for purposes of the Freedom of Information Act and the Environmental Information Regulations.
