## **Annex B: Impact Assessment**

- 1. Section 9 of the Academies Act 2010 (later as amended by the Education Act 2011) places a duty upon the Secretary of State to take into account what the impact of establishing the institution would likely be on maintained schools, Academies, institutions within the further education sector and alternative provision in the area in which the institution is (or is proposed to be) situated. Any adverse impact will need to be balanced against the benefits of establishing the new school.
- 2. The LA is supportive of the Free School and is planning for its opening. Barking and Dagenham is an area of high basic need and has one of the fastest growing school-age populations in the country. The secondary pupil population in the LA area is forecast to increase by 45.9% between 2011/12 and 2018/19. Barking Riverside, the proposed location for the Riverside Free School, is a distinct community on the southern edge of the Borough, defined by the A13 trunk road to the north and The River Thames to the south.
- 3. Overall, officials judge that the size and location of the Riverside Free School, coupled with the integration into the local authority strategic plan for the area, means that any impact of the Free School is manageable. Within the local area of the proposed school, it is expected that five schools will feel a minimal impact, but no threat to the future viability of any of these schools, one school will feel a moderate impact and no school will feel a high impact on the opening of the proposed Free School. Although the impact on Woolwich Polytechnic School for Boys has been assessed as moderate on the basis that it is within a 2 miles radius, in practice the impact will be less since this school is located on the south side of the River Thames which acts as an effective barrier.
- 4. As the Riverside Free School includes a sixth form, an assessment has been made of the impact on local colleges. The proposed Free School is predicted to have a minimal impact on four colleges and a moderate impact on three colleges. No colleges are predicted to experience a high impact. Of the three colleges which will be moderately impact, only one, Newham Sixth Form College is on the north side of The River Thames. Newham Sixth Form College is exclusively sixth form and as such there may be a moderate impact. However, the college is over four miles away so is not expected to lose significant numbers to the Riverside Free School. The Free School is unlikely to affect the long term viability of this sixth form college.
- 5. The establishment of The Riverside School is likely to have a positive impact in improving parental choice by widening the number and type of places available, and by driving up standards in surrounding schools and colleges.
- 6. In the light of the evidence there is no reason why the Secretary of State should not enter into a Funding Agreement as a result of negative impact.
