Overall organisation summary

In the first quarter of the financial year a key highlight has been the momentum that is building from an investment led approach in skills and employment. To date we have co-invested £77m with employers through our Investment Funds, encouraging businesses to drive enterprise, growth and create jobs. 269 bids were received in the first round of the Employer Ownership Pilot.

Secondly, we have completed and published the findings from the world's most comprehensive skills survey, the UK Commission's Employer Skills Survey, which provides an accurate picture of the shape of employer demand and the skills and employment landscape. With responses from over 87,500 businesses, the survey provides robust intelligence on which to base policy and decision making. The results can be cut by sector and local area and we are already finding a ready audience to use these insights including people, businesses and providers as policy makers.

Thirdly, we have increased our focus on youth employment with the publication of the Youth Employment Challenge. This work has shown that only 1 in 4 employers now recruit directly from education – creating a perfect storm for young people trying to get into and progress in work. The recent high levels of coverage of the 'death of the Saturday job' by the media shows how this issue resonates with the wider public.
