In view of this, and the fact that the distances between the Cowes Enterprise College and Island Free School may result in the former losing some pupils and exacerbate its existing surplus capacity, the Island Free School may affect the short term financial viability of Cowes Enterprise College until such time as the Isle of Wight Strategy for dealing with surplus places within the authority has been agreed and implemented.</p>
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
