Thank you for your email of 15 December where you requested the following information:

The following Daily Telegraph report refers to a report issued at the beginning of November and supplementary information which has just been released:

The Telegraph article indicates that the report was issued by DECC and the supplementary information as a result of an FoI request.

I have looked at your web site and can find no reference to the report on your main page or any reference to the supplementary information in your FoI section.

I would be grateful if you would send me the URLs of the initial report and the subsequently released supplementary information.

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act'), you have the right to:

- know whether we hold the information you require
- be provided with that information (subject to any exemptions under the Act which may apply).

I can confirm that the Department holds the information you have requested. However, the information is already in the public domain and is therefore exempt under Section 21 of the Act as the information is already reasonably accessible to you. Appeals Procedure
