My request relates to Module 2 Driver CPC case study exams. I would like to know how many theory tests have been taken to date. How many of them were 1st time passes, 2nd time passes, 3rd time passes and 4th time and above passes.

This relates to PCV and LGV Driver CPC module 2. If I could also have the answer by disciple (i.e. how many PCV and how many LGV).

For PCV please go back to September 2008 and for LGV please go back to September 2009.

The table below shows the number of candidates who passed their CPC Module 2 test on their first, second, third or fourth plus attempt. This data covers the period 1 September 2009 to 30 September 2013 for LGV tests and 1 September 2008 to 30 September 2013 for PCV tests.
