The blocks are in the southern North Sea, 43/4, 43/5, 43/7, 43/8, 43/9 & 43/11, and all within or impinging	
on the Dogger Bank SCI. These blocks were assessed for the award of Traditional licences and it was	
concluded they required Appropriate Assessment. However, the applications for these blocks have now	
been confirmed as for Promote licences. As a consequence these blocks would be deleted from Table 6.1	
and added to Table 5.3 – and in the future, should applications be received to change any of these to	
Traditional licences, the Department will undertake HRA for the potential for likely significant effects on	
European sites in advance of any such decisions.	
In addition, Block 42/14b was omitted from Table 2.1; the block is in the southern North Sea and remote	
from any European site. The application for this part block is for a Promote licence and based on the	
screening process followed it also would not be taken forward to AA at this stage.
