Subject: How many US Congressmen support the "Genocide bill"?

According to the information from Armenian Assembly of America, another seven congressmen expressed their support to the resolution recognising the 1915 events in Ottoman Empire as Genocide. Thus, there are **134** supporters of resolution in US Congress.

On March 17, legislation calling on the US president to properly recognise the Armenian Genocide was introduced in the House of Representatives, two weeks before President Obama's April 5 trip to Turkey and roughly a month before the White House's annual April 24 commemoration.

The measure, H.Res.252, is spearheaded by lead sponsors Adam Schiff (D-Calif.) and George Radanovich (R-Calif.) and Congressional Armenian Caucus co-chairs Frank Pallone (D-N.J.) and Mark Kirk (R-Ill.), and is co-sponsored by over 70 House colleagues. The resolution is identical to the one introduced in both the House and Senate in the 110th Congress, which was adopted by the House Foreign Affairs Committee [redacted] and Bush Administration, and publicly endorsed by then-candidate for President Barack Obama, Vice President Joe Biden and Secretary of State Hillary Clinton.
