Report on: Co-operation and Competition Update

Summary:

 This report provides the Board with information about the significant developments with regard to the work of the Co-operation and Competition directorate since the meeting of the Board on 29 October 2014. The Board is asked to note the report.

Complaint by Spire Healthcare Limited against Blackpool Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) and Fylde and Wyre CCG into the commissioning of elective services in Blackpool and the surrounding area

- 2. The Co-operation and Competition directorate investigated a complaint from Spire Healthcare that patients were being directed towards Blackpool Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust and that patient choice was not working effectively in the Blackpool CCG and Fylde and Wyre CCG areas.
- 3. On 25 September 2014 the final report was published. The directorate found that whilst patients were not being directed towards Blackpool Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, the CCGs were not meeting their obligations to ensure patients were given choice and to promote that choice to patients.
- 4. Since then, both CCGs have submitted proposals on how they will meet their obligations. Monitor is now considering their proposals and whether any further action is necessary.

Making a difference for patients:
