HARBOURS ACT 1964 SECTION 40A: DESIGNATION OF THE STATUTORY HARBOUR AUTHORITIES FOR 26 HARBOURS IN ENGLAND AND 5 NON-FISHERY HARBOURS IN WALES WITH THE POWER TO GIVE HARBOUR DIRECTIONS

The Harbours Act 1964 was amended by section 5 of the Marine Navigation Act 2013 which inserted new sections 40A-40D inclusive which provide a mechanism by which the Secretary of State may, by order, designate harbour authorities with the power to give harbour directions to better regulate shipping and improve safety within their harbour area.

This consultation seeks your views on the applications received from statutory harbour authorities for 26 harbours in England and 5 non-fishery harbours in Wales requesting to be designated with the power to give harbour directions.

One of the applicant harbour authorities (Associated British Ports - ABP - in respect of Ipswich) has existing powers of general direction which overlap with the harbour directions powers that would be conferred under section 40A of the Harbours Act 1964. If ABP Ipswich is designated their existing powers of general direction (see paragraphs 1.17-1.23 of the consultation document) would need to be repealed.

The consultation will close on Friday 16 January 2015.
