The Armed Forces Covenant

An Enduring Covenant Between

The People of the United Kingdom Her Majesty's Government

and -

All those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces of the Crown

And their Families

The first duty of Government is the defence of the realm. Our Armed Forces fulfil that responsibility on behalf of the Government, sacrificing some civilian freedoms, facing danger and, sometimes, suffering serious injury or death as a result of their duty. Families also play a vital role in supporting the operational effectiveness of our Armed Forces. In return, the whole nation has a moral obligation to the members of the Naval Service, the Army and the Royal Air Force, together with their families.

They deserve our respect and support, and fair treatment.

Those who serve in the Armed Forces, whether Regular or Reserve, those who have served in the past, and their families, should face no disadvantage compared to other citizens in the provision of public and commercial services. Special consideration is appropriate in some cases, especially for those who have given most such as the injured and the bereaved.

This obligation involves the whole of society: it includes voluntary and charitable bodies, private organisations, and the actions of individuals in supporting the Armed Forces. Recognising those who have performed military duty unites the country and demonstrates the value of their contribution. This has no greater expression than in upholding this Covenant.

Section 1: Principles Of The Armed Forces Corporate Covenant

- 1.1 We Canterbury College will endeavour in our business dealings to uphold the key principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, which are:
 - no member of the Armed Forces Community should face disadvantage in the provision of public and commercial services compared to any other citizen
 - in some circumstances special treatment may be appropriate especially for the injured or bereaved.

Section 2: Demonstrating our Commitment

- 2.1 Canterbury College recognises the value serving personnel, reservists, veterans and military families bring to our business. We will seek to uphold the principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, by:
 - promoting the fact that we are an armed forces-friendly organisation; by having a designated Armed Forces Liaison Officer and dedicated web page.
 - seeking to support the employment of veterans young and old; by making Canterbury

 Training and Recruitment (CTR) benefits available to be utilised.
 - striving to support the employment of Service spouses and partners; by affording all the same benefits to the entire Armed Forces community.
 - endeavouring to offer a degree of flexibility in granting leave for Service spouses and partners before, during and after a partner's deployment; in line with our HR policy.
 - seeking to support our employees who choose to be members of the Reserve forces, including by accommodating their training and deployment where possible; by allowing staff time off for training and operational deployments in line with Canterbury College HR policy.
 - offering support to our local cadet units, either in our local community or in local schools, where possible; by obtaining funding for specific projects to raise awareness and provide recognised qualifications for both staff and cadets.

- aiming to actively participate in Armed Forces Day; by having a visible presence at events, coverage on Canterbury College website and partaking in 'uniform to work day' for college staff members who are currently serving with the Army Reserve.
- offering a discount to members of the Armed Forces Community; by allowing the Armed Forces community the use of Canterbury College facilities at the subsidised rate.
- any additional commitments Canterbury College could make (based on local circumstances).
- Canterbury College will provide advice and guidance for those looking to progress within the Armed Forces or those looking for resettlement options and the transition into civilian life.
- Where possible look for funding to provide free or discounted learning.
- 2.2 We will publicise these commitments through our literature and/or on our website, setting out how we will seek to honour them and inviting feedback from the Service community and our customers on how we are doing.
