You should be aware that April 2015 marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Armenian massacres in the last days of the Ottoman Empire. Over the next year there will be a major international campaign to secure recognition by the UK, and other governments such [redacted] those massacres as a genocide. For Armenians, there are clear parallels between the Holocaust and their treatment by the Ottoman Government. They sometimes repeat words which were attributed to Hitler on the eve of the invasion of Poland that: "Who, after all, speaks to-day of the annihilation of the Armenians?".

We have clear lines setting out the British Government view on why we don't recognise the massacres as a genocide and on how we are seeking to promote understanding and reconciliation between Armenia and Turkey. But because of its stance on the Armenian massacres, it is possible

that Britain will be criticised for double standards as it seeks to carry out its role as Chair of the IHRA especially in the coming year and **[redacted]** can supply you with our current lines. **[redacted]**
