Multi million pound boat contracts for designer

Young boat designer Henry Ward has recently sold plans for a new luxury speed yacht in France and Asia. Henry's career was kick started after he graduated in Transport Design from the University of Huddersfield and soon after began work for Cockwell's Boatyard, in Mylor, Cornwall, under the Unlocking Potential scheme. Unlocking Potential receives ESF (European Social Fund) Convergence investment to help SMEs (small and medium sized enterprises) in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly to employ graduates.

Success for Secret Fridays

An innovative pilot project in Liskeard, Cornwall is enabling young people with difficult backgrounds to gain confidence and skills through helping to organise major monthly events. Since the project started in May, 14 young people have benefited from taking part, with four going into employment and others planning to go to college this month. As well as receiving basic

employability skills training, the project creates potential employment routes for participants by

working in partnership with local traders. Activities so far include a puppet show, film events and a Pirate trail and Pirate party.
