Report on: Co-operation and Competition update

Summary:

 This report provides the Board with information about the significant developments with regard to the work of the Co-operation and Competition directorate since the meeting of the Board on 25 June 2014.

Recommendations:

2. The Board is asked to note the update on the work of the Co-operation and Competition directorate.

Potential pathology merger in North West England

3. The directorate has completed the review of the proposed merger of the pathology activities of Southport and Ormskirk NHS Trust and St Helens and Knowsley Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust. The recommendation to the NHS Trust Development Authority (NHS TDA), as agreed by the Cooperation and Competition Executive, was that this merger is not likely to have an adverse effect on patients as a result of a loss of choice or competition. The directorate published a non-confidential version of its report setting out its advice to the NHS TDA on 11 July 2014.

Making a difference for patients:
