The IA says the proposal is a deregulatory measure that will have a net direct benefit to business (an 'OUT') with an Equivalent Annual Net Cost to Business of (-)£0.31m. This is consistent with the current One-in, One-out Methodology (paragraph 18) and provides a reasonable assessment of the likely impacts.
