

<p><b>Have the necessary burden reductions required by One-in, One-out been identified and are they robust?</b></p> <p>The IA says the proposal is a deregulatory measure that will have a net direct benefit to business (an 'OUT') with an Equivalent Annual Net Cost to Business of (-)£0.31m. This is consistent with the current One-in, One-out Methodology (paragraph 18) and provides a reasonable assessment of the likely impacts.</p>
