Your correspondence dated 22 July 2014 has been considered to be a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000. You requested the following information:

I am writing to request information on how much the British army is spending on war per year and how much it's costing the taxpayer.

The Ministry of Defence (MOD) does not hold the precise information that you have requested. The budgetary structure of the MOD does not show separately the costs or budgets of the three individual Armed Services. This is because large parts of the Armed Services operate as fully integrated joint organisations in which elements from the Navy, Army and Air Force work closely together and share land, buildings and facilities, and sometimes equipment.

The Defence Statistics organisation publishes a wealth of information about defence spending. Most of this is available from their website which you can access using the following link:

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
