LEA is expected to attract pupils from the north of their school location at Aldgate and Whitechapel. Given that both schools have different catchment areas and the basic need for secondary places in Tower Hamlets is expected to increase, the effect on pupil admissions and long term financial viability of WH is not expected to be affected by the opening of LEA free school. |
