Notes:

1. All Reserves location statistics are estimates. The quality of the data is unknown as validation exercises remain ongoing.
2. Army Reserve comprises Volunteer Reserve personnel and includes mobilised reservists, High Readiness Reserves (HRR), those serving on Additional Duties Commitments (ADC), Non Regular Permanent Staff (NRPS), Expeditionary Forces Institute (EFI), Sponsored Reserves, and University Officer Training Corps (UOTC). It does not include personnel serving on Full Time Reserve Service (FTRS).
3. These statistics represent personnel whose stationed location is reported as Wales in the Joint Personnel Administration (JPA) system. The statistics do not necessarily represent personnel who are Welsh, who live in Wales or have been recruited in Wales. It is possible for personnel to be recruited in Wales, but then be stationed elsewhere in the UK and vice versa.
4. Army Reserve (Group A) includes mobilised reservists, High Readiness Reserves (HRR), those serving on Additional Duties Commitments (ADC), plus support and training staff for the University Officer Training Corps (UOTC). It excludes Full Time Reserve Service (FTRS), Non Regular Permanent Staff (NRPS), Expeditionary Forces Institute (EFI) and Sponsored Reserves.
5. Intake and Outflow statistics are only available for the Army Reserve (Group A).
6. Intake from another part of the Armed Forces includes personnel joining the Army Reserve (Group A) either by transferring from the Regular Forces or another Reserve Force, by re-joining the Army Reserve, or by transferring from another part of the Army Reserve that is not part of Group A.
7. Outflow to another part of the Armed Forces includes personnel leaving the Army Reserve (Group A) and transferring to the Regular Forces or another Reserve Force, or transferring to another part of the Army Reserve that is not part of Group A.
8. Intake and Outflow statistics do not include any Army Reserve (Group A) personnel that may have changed their stationed location. For example transferring from England to Wales or vice versa.

Rounding:

All statistics are rounded to the nearest 10. Numbers ending in 5 have been rounded to the nearest multiple of 20 to prevent systematic bias.

Totals and sub-totals are rounded separately and so may not equal the sum of their rounded parts.
