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PBiii will be a 620 place, co-educational secondary school for pupils aged 11-19. The free school is proposed to be set up in the Ladywood area of Birmingham local authority and it has no specialism or faith ethos.

The tables show that there are 15 schools within the local area of this free school and 5 colleges. The standards in nearby schools and colleges are mixed. Although PBiii will have a minimal impact on the majority of schools and colleges, it could potentially have a moderate impact on 5 schools and 1 college and a high impact on 1 school. The high impact school has attainment well below the national average, was undersubscribed for entry in 2011/12, has a surplus of places of 36% and was judged as 'requires improvement' by Ofsted.

The opening of PBiii would create a surplus of secondary places in the short term, but the local authority have confirmed that the development of the additional places will eliminate the need for at least 1 of the 4 new schools that Birmingham would need to provide by the year 2019.

PBiii will be the third Perry Beeches school to open in Birmingham, following on from the success of 'Perry Beeches The Academy' and 'Perry Beeches II The Free School'. An application for Perry Beeches IV has been approved and this school is proposed to open in September 2014.

The chief executive officer of Perry Beeches turned around the original failing Perry Beeches secondary school into one which recently got an outstanding Ofsted rating. PBiii is therefore expected to have a positive impact by providing high quality education and parents are likely to be attracted by the Perry Beeches brand.
