Since being placed in Special Measures in December 2012, an Interim Executive Board has replaced the governing body and the school is now in a hard federation with The Cooper School (see below). The head teacher from The Cooper School is executive head of the federation. Local councillors have expressed their concern about the effect on this school but neither the school nor parents raised any concerns in the S10 consultation. We expect the Free School to

						provide competition and raise educational standards in the local area.
