Thank you for your e-mails of 6 and 20 October 2014 requesting the following information:

a copy (either electronic or paper copy) of the historical Army policy AGAI Volume 2 Chapter 64 (AGAI 64) – Substance Misuse Issue 1.0(date unknown)... In summary I am now requesting a copy of the AGAI relating to Drug Misuse/Substance Misuse that was applicable during the dates of May 2010 and August 2011.

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Please find enclosed a copy of Army General and Administrative Instruction Volume 2 Chapter 64 – Issue 1.0. Please note that this only refers to Alcohol Abuse and not Substance Misuse. In response to your earlier request under FOIA, I provided you with a copy of Army General and Administrative Instruction Volume 5 which relates to Drug Misuse. These two separate documents were merged into Army General and Administrative Instruction Volume 2 Chapter 64 Substance Misuse on 2 August 2011 but separately were applicable for the period you have identified.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance Team, First Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
