Information released

1. The pay scales for someone undertaking an Apprenticeship within your department.

The relevant salary scale is £20,369 - £24,461 (National) and £23,869 - £27,961 (London).

2. Apprentices in the department broken down by year from the scheme's creation.

Six Civil Service Fast Track Apprentices were appointed in September 2013.

3. Annual leave entitlements for an Apprentice within your department.

They are entitled to 30 days annual leave per annum.

4. Contracted hours per week.

They are contracted to work 41 hours per week in London or 42 hours nationally.

5. From the onset of the scheme how many Apprentices have been dismissed.

No apprentices have been dismissed since the start of the scheme.

6. From the onset of the scheme how many Apprentices have resigned.

The information relating to this question constitutes personal data and has been withheld. Section 40 of the Act provides an absolute exemption for personal data which then falls to be dealt with under the Data Protection Act. Personal data of third parties can only be disclosed in accordance with the data protection principles. In particular, the first data protection principle requires that disclosure must be fair and lawful and must comply with one of the conditions in Schedule 2 of the Data Protection Act. We do not think that it is fair to release the number of apprentices who have resigned and do not think that any of the relevant conditions apply.
