### Purpose of notice

1. To provide guidance to European caseworkers on what to do when they receive an application for a Family Member Residence Stamp (FMRS) from the non-EEA national family member of a Croatian working in accordance with the worker authorisation requirements.

#### The FMRS

2. Where a Croatian needs permission to work in the UK and is working in line with a worker authorisation document (also known as a purple registration certificate) their family member can obtain a document confirming their right to live and work in the UK. As the Croatian sponsor is subject to worker authorisation, they are not regarded as a 'qualified person' and their family members are not entitled to a residence card. Instead the appropriate document is the FMRS. Third country national family members normally apply for the FMRS using the CR5 application form.

#### Impact on other FMRS applications

5. This notice <u>only</u> applies to FMRS applications from third country national family members of Croatians. FMRS applications made by non-EEA family members of Bulgarians or Romanians are not affected and should continue to be processed in the normal way.

6. A further notice and, if appropriate, guidance will be issued in due course once this issue has been resolved. Until then, this notice will remain in force.
