## The questions


The Department of Health wrote a plan in 2010 for adults with autism in England.

We also wrote a separate guide in 2010 to tell local councils and NHS organisations how to use the **Think Autism** plan.






Now we are updating the guide for local councils and NHS organisations because some things have changed since 2010.



The updated guide tells you about our ideas and asks what you think about them. It is called a **consultation**.




What you think about the guide is very important to us. There are a number of ways you can tell us.


