Local employers took their work into Penair School in Cornwall for a 'Have a Go' day on 1st July 2014 so that students could try out a skill used in the workplace – and find out more about their future career options. This is one of may Skills Show Experience events taking place around the country which raise the profile of skills, vocational training and apprenticeships.

Luton programme helping young people to leave crime behind

The Reactiv8 ESF project in Luton is helping young people who come from a background of lawlessness and gang culture onto a positive pathway with its new Reach for the Stars programme. The programme is run by former PE teacher Michelle Crook and her business partner Jon Reynolds, who did active service in Kosovo and Afghanistan. Seven

young people were taken on initially to the 12 week course, and half way through the course in June three of them had already found employment. The course demands a high degree of commitment from participants and combines formal education methods with British military techniques. One participant, 27-year-old Charlene, who has a history of drug abuse and violent crime, is now fully employed and acts as an ambassador for the programme. "At first I thought the REactiv8 programme was just another course, but it's changed my way of thinking and made me much more positive."
