Thank you for your email of 9 June asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000 in regards to the Illegal Wildlife Trade Conference in February 2014. You asked:

- What was the total cost of the event, as detailed above?
- Please provide a breakdown of the total cost of the conference and any additional cost that would have been as a result of this conference – for example postconference event(s) (drinks).

We can confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.

The Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) held the budget for the conference, which was jointly organised by the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs (DEFRA), Home Office (HO) and Department for International Development (DfID).

In advance of the conference a maximum budget was of £555,772 was agreed and cleared through the Cabinet Office Spending Exemption Committee and approved by the Cabinet Secretary, The Rt. Hon Francis Maude MP. In the end the conference came in under budget at £293,883.46 excluding VAT. There were no post-conference drinks or similar costs.
