Annex B: Impact Assessment

- Section 9 of the Academies Act 2010 (later as amended by the Education Act 2011) places on duty on the Secretary of State to take into account what the impact of establishing the institution would likely be on maintained schools, Academies, institutions within the further education sector and alternative provision in the area in which the institution is (or is proposed to be) situated. Any adverse impact will need to be balanced against the benefits of establishing the new school.
- 2. We have carried out an Impact Assessment (see the table below) which concludes that the impact on most local schools should be minimal. Southend YMCA Community School will have little impact on secondary schools and colleges as the needs of the pupils are different to those in mainstream provision and the schools will work together to ensure pupils are reintegrated into mainstream provision where possible.
- 3. The impact on the PRUs locally will also be minimal as the age range for pupils at Southend YMCA Community School is much narrower and Southend Borough Council's PRU offers overnight stays. PRUs in and around Southend are also oversubscribed, demonstrating the need for places in the area.
- 4. Southend Borough Council is supportive of the establishment of Southend YMCA Community School. The Interim Corporate Director of Children & Learning has written to the Department identifying demand for places for vulnerable pupils and stating that the proposed school will make a valuable contribution to the options available for these learners. It is also stated that the planned learning programme is fully supported and addresses the specific pupil needs.
- 5. The assessment has concluded that the Free School will have a minimal overall impact on the surrounding schools, colleges and PRUs and the creation of this Free School fits within the local authority's strategic plan for alternative provision. We therefore we conclude that it is appropriate for the Secretary of State to enter into a funding agreement with the free school trust in light of the possible impacts on the basis that:
 - The school will provide alternative provision places in an area of need
 - The additional school will be likely to improve standards in the area for the anticipated pupil cohort
 - The school will work in collaboration with the other schools locally to provide the best education for the pupil needs
 - The additional school will give parents greater education choice in the area
