


Don't rush into buying abroad




Consider your long-term financial requirements

Find out how exchange rates and inflation will affect your income, pension and/or benefits, and calculate the cost of living.

Read up on tax regulations

Research the taxes that will apply to you in your new home and in the UK at gov.uk/tax-right -retire-abroad -return-to-uk



Plan for your health

Take out health insurance until you are registered under the local state system. Visit nhs.uk/NHS England/Healthcareabroad /movingabroad

Seek independent legal advice
