The need to identify and target Local Authorities / NHS Trusts which are not aware or Veterans' Affairs - with a view to encouraging the adoption of best practice as demonstrated by HULL and NYCC with regards to Pathways. Identification of Veteran and Vulnerable Veterans to ensure focussed use of resources The need for Member's comments on the Resettlement Consultation paper (Enclosure 3) The Chairman concluded by thanking members who had volunteered to act as Sub Group Leads and also to those who had offered to stand for the role of Vice Chair. The Meeting agreed that the Chairman could make an executive decision regarding this appointment. Regional Welfare Mr Eddie Devlin, The Regional Welfare Manager for our region, provided a good overview of the changes within Welfare Services and Manager

	their provision since the restructuring of SPVA and the suspension of War Pensions Committees.
	The key issues he raised included a significant increase in welfare needs from young veterans and their dependants due to increased survivability from injuries and wounds.
	He also reported on the improvements in picking up Veteran's and their needs prior to their release from service. This attacks the potential for veterans to disappear off the radar on exit from the Services.
	His final point regarded the new complexities of the veteran and associated dependants compared to traditional models. As an example he recently assisted with a case where a veteran had identified dependents through a number of relationships.
	The Regional Welfare Manager agreed to provide Activity Reports for the committee and also to assist in making arrangements for a presentation on the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme to be made. [Action 2.6]
	The Chair outlined how each Sub-Group should provide detailed reports for the meetings. It was understood that Sub-Groups had not yet had time to form properly and the need for Sub-Group Meetings was identified. [Action 2.7]
•	In order to assist in the identification of skills and experience within the committee, Members are requested to provide a general Biography for inclusion in the GoogleDoc shared area. Members are also requested to identify a single sub group to support where they currently sit within more than 1. [Action 2.8]
	Mr Alex Baxter provided an update presentation on the activity of the Health and Local Authorities Sub Group (Enclosure 4).
	The Chair emphasised that our overall role was to be both the Advocate and Ombudsman of Veterans' Affairs.
AOB	The Chair reported that several members had raised the issue of commercial businesses advertising for work from veterans - mainly on a no win, no fee basis.
	He pointed out, that whilst less than ideal, it was not an activity that could be challenged other than by raising our own profile within the Region - by making us the first point of contact.
	He also thanked Mr Bentham-Bates for the identification and listing of all the MP's within our Region. The Chair will include all these in his letter run to Local Authorities and NHS Trusts etc.
