Thank you for your email of 2 July 2014 requesting information on correspondence between DECC and HM Treasury about the UK's contribution to the Green Climate Fund. Specifically, you requested "copies of all emails exchanged between Peter Betts or Ben Lyon and the Treasury on that topic between 1 April and 30 June 2014." Your request has been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ('the Act').

Under the FOI Act you have the right to:

- know whether we hold the information you require
- be provided with that information (subject to any exemptions under the Act which may apply).

I would like to inform you that we have undertaken a review of the email correspondence from this period and can confirm that there are no relevant documents related to your query. Further, in doing so, we were also easily able to consider if there were other correspondence on the issue of the UK's contribution to the Green Climate Fund involving Peter Betts and/ or me and HM Treasury; we can also inform you that there was none.

Appeals Procedure

If you are dissatisfied with the handling of your request, you have the right to ask for an internal review. Internal review requests should be submitted within two months of the date of receipt of the response to your original letter and should be sent to the Information Rights Unit at:
