Report on:	Provider Appraisal Update

Introduction:

1. The Provider Appraisal directorate currently has three active assessments, with no decisions to be taken this month. There are two ongoing transaction reviews.

A. Update on assessments

2. A list of the 13 NHS trusts currently with Monitor for assessment is provided in Annex 1. Any changes from the last report are highlighted in red.

Active assessments (exception reporting)

3. The NHS Trust Development Authority referred Mersey Care NHS Trust for assessment at its November Board meeting, and the assessment was kicked off on 25 November 2015.

Assessment Pipeline

4. An overview of the assessment pipeline is provided in Annex 2.

B. Update on transactions and new models of care (NMoC)

Transaction Pipeline

- The review of Ashford and St Peter's Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust and Royal Surrey County Hospital NHS Foundation Trust is expected to commence early in the New Year under the streamlined approach agreed at November 2015 Provider Appraisal Executive (PAE).
- 6. The first of the new models of care vanguard transactions in still planned to go ahead from 1 April 2016. The team continues to work with Salford Royal NHS

Foundation Trust on evaluating this project. A paper updating the PAE on the team's proposed approach will be considered at the next PAE meeting.

7. The review of Cornwall Partnership NHS Foundation Trust taking on the community services currently delivered by Peninsula Community Health commenced on 1 December 2015. A stage 1 transaction review meeting was held on 2 December 2015 to discuss the strategic rationale and timetable.

Making a difference for patients:

Monitor's mission is to make the health sector work better for patients. This report provides an update on the Provider Appraisal team. The key focus of this team is to assess if providers are well led and can therefore deliver sustainable high quality services to patients.

It is not considered that there are any decisions within this paper which would impact on protected groups Identified by the Act.

The information is exempt as it falls under section 36 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.
