Notes:

NOTE: Registration date is derived from the date at which a NINo is maintained on the National Insurance Recording and Pay as you Earn System (NPS).

Out of Work Benefit

JSA - Jobseekers Allowance

ESA - Employment and Support Allowance

IB / SDA - Incapacity Benefit / Severe Disablement Allowance

The above tables show the latest figures where benefits data relating to the 6 month reporting period are available.

Registration year 10/11 is not shown as the figures would be subject to change.

Benefits are arranged hierarchically (JSA, ESA, IB, IS) and claimants are assigned to the topmost benefit which they receive to avoid double counting.

Employment and Support Allowance (ESA). ESA replaced Incapacity Benefit and Income Support paid on the grounds of incapacity for new claims from 27th October 2008
