Thank you for your emails of 17 July requesting the following information:

*Details of any written advice regarding the availability of British Army vehicles stored forward in continental European locations outside the UK during exercise Black Eagle?*

*A list of British Army vehicles that were deployed in Exercise Black Eagle in Poland in 2014 and the location of where the vehicles were sourced from?*

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held. No information was found relating to your request for written advice. The list of British Army vehicles is below. Equipment was sourced from the Theatre Fleet Support Units in Monchengladbach Germany, and in Ashchurch UK and units within 3 (UK) Division, around Tidworth UK.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that there were media articles published at the time of Exercise Black Eagle. Some of the places the articles appeared were the Salisbury Journal, the Western Daily Press, the Telegraph Online and BBC News, as well as the Army website:

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
