Thank you for your e-mail dated 27 February requesting information under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You asked:

Please could I have the number of drivers from Warrington who have a driving licence aged 90 plus (broken down into male and female)

The following table provides the number of driving licence holders with addresses in Warrington (WA1 –WA5 and WA13) aged 90 plus, broken down into male and female.

The oldest women with penalty points on her licence is 91. The oldest man with penalty points on his licence is 94.
