

New plan for Hankyu to Shin Osaka travel:

09:30 Everyone leaves the hotel in the hired two vehicles (one of us will come to the hotel and another to wait for the vehicles at the destination)

09:40 Everyone gets off with all their luggage at Hankyu

09:50 Enter Hankyu Department Store (Leave all luggage with Hankyu staff)

10:00-10:25 Hankyu British Fair (9F)

10:25 Leave 9F with luggage

When you exit the store, you only have to cross a road and the JR ticket gate is more or less right there. There are escalators and elevators at both Osaka and Shin-Osaka Stations, so our view is everything will be manageable. Officials from the BCG will accompany you to Shin-Osaka.







Boris Johnson is pushing for British companies to secure a share of £10 billion worth of contracts in the run-up to the Japanese Olympics and rugby world cup during a trade mission to the nation.

Mr Johnson will hold talks to promote UK businesses on the back of the success of the 2012 London Games at a "crucial moment" in the procurement process in Japan.

The Mayor of London arrived in Osaka tonight ahead of series of meetings over the next three days with Japanese politicians, business leaders and investors.

He said: "Tokyo has got the Olympics in just five years' time, they have got the rugby world cup in four years' time.

"This is a crucial moment for them in their procurement. They have got ± 10 billion worth of contracts going out.

"We think that British companies ought to be trying to compete, ought to be offering their services there."

Mr Johnson went on a walkabout in the bustling Dotonbori area of Osaka, stopping to learn how to cook octopus balls before trying one of the local delicacies.

His appearance caused a stir in the busy neon-lit streets, with some locals recognising the Conservative MP and stopping him for selfies.

Science, fashion and motoring will dominate the agenda of the trade mission as the Conservative MP holds talks in the port city, Tokyo and Yokohama.

Tomorrow, he will champion the capital's global reputation for fashion as he promotes major British export brands at the Hankyu department store in the city before heading to Tokyo to attend the opening of a new Burberry store in the city.

The Japanese tour will also include talks to bolster technological trade ties with the nation, which was the fourth largest investor in London last year, including in financial technology, such as contactless payment systems, and biosciences.

Japanese media coverage of visit to Japan by Boris Johnson, Mayor of London, 11-15 Oct 2015

Summary

- The mayor's visit featured prominently in all of Japan's national dailies including the 'big 6' papers* and key TV stations.
- Coverage throughout was positive, with local media taking advantage of the opportunity to introduce the mayor (comparatively unknown in Japan) and accompanying UK messaging to their audiences.
- The London-Tokyo signing ceremony with Governor Masuzoe attracted the most widespread coverage, with reports emphasising the two cities' closer relationship thanks to sharing of London's experience and expertise in global sports for ahead of WRC2019 and Tokyo 2020.
- Japan's major TV stations used the footage of the Mayor with the Governor a few times in news programmes from early evening of 14 October to early morning of 15 October.
- The street rugby event was also featured heavily on Japanese TV evening and morning news. As with the widespread UK press and online coverage, the immediate hook was the tackling a Japanese schoolboy, but reporting remained positive and went on to cover key messages about global sports and why the mayor was in Japan.
- 1. Yomiuri (daily circ. 10.02 million): It is considered a conservative newspaper, but also widely popular, and its readers are more socially diversified than those of the Asahi or the Nikkei.
- 2. Asahi (daily circ. 8.04 million): Read by the enormous majority of the country's intellectuals, its political orientation is to the left.
- 3. Mainichi (daily circ. 3.97 million): It is a moderate newspaper, close to the ideas defended by the Asahi, but more on the centre so that it can be categorised as centre-left oriented.
- 4. Nihon Keizai (Nikkei) (daily circ. 3.04 million): It is the major economic newspaper. Despite a lower circulation than the other dailies, it is very influential within business and political circles.
- 5. Sankei (daily circ. 2.19 million): It is the most conservative of the Japanese newspapers. It distinguishes itself by its anti-communist stance.

6. **Tokyo-Chunichi Shimbun** (group circulation: 3.55 million) is by far the most powerful regional paper, born from a link between the local Tokyo paper and the Chunichi group (Nagoya).

Online

- The pre-arrival video message published successfully built anticipation and online interest, reaching over 40,000 viewers on the embassy's Facebook (259 likes, 107 shares, 18 comments).
- Synching of embassy and MoL's digital content calendars worked well, with MoL content pushed out further to Japanese audiences with Japanese language translations.
- The visit attracted coverage by influential Japanese bloggers and photos of the mayor were circulated widely on social media, particularly the interactions from Osaka from Michael Shearer's Twitter.
- FCO regional data ranked UKinJapan's social media channels in the top 10 for every day that week (reach and engagement) due largely to popular visit content.
