Summary of Statutory Section 10 Consultation

The Trust's formal statutory consultation took place in April and May of 2014. As noted in the main body of this submission, the consultation report provides encouraging but not wholly convincing evidence of demand for the UTC. As also noted in the main body, there was strong agreement that the Trust and the Secretary of State should enter into a funding agreement, as well as for the proposed site for the UTC with 164 (71%) of 230 respondents agreeing the proposed site. Other strong, positive findings included: approval of the UTC's vision (183 (80%) of 230 respondents); agreement with the proposed admissions and SEN arrangements (157 (69%) of 230 respondents for each). As noted in the main body, there was less strong support for the UTC's specialisms (123 (54%) of respondents agreeing "very much" that the proposed specialisms are important areas for skills development, with a similar response in support of the project-led curriculum (58% of respondents). And finally, as also noted in the main body, there is evidence of interest in the UTC from parents/potential students but this is not wholly convincing. Local authority section 9 letters were sent to North Lincolnshire and North East Lincolnshire Councils. Unsurprisingly given its backing of the UTC project, North Lincolnshire Council's response was supportive, stating that "whilst we currently have an oversupply of secondary places across the local authority area as a result of demographic change, there is a recognised need to diversify the range of learning opportunities for our young people if we are to meet the skills challenge of our emerging economy. This is particularly true within the renewables and energy sectors in which the Humber UTC will specialise". We did not receive a response from North east Lincolnshire Council. The impact assessment shown above indicates there could be a high impact on two catchment area secondary schools.

Conclusion

Based on the evidence available from the UTC's consultation survey, contextual data, local authority statements and application evidence of demand from employers, we conclude it would be appropriate for the Secretary of State to enter into a Funding Agreement with the Humber UTC Trust. The UTC's distinct offer, employer, OGAT and Council backing are all encouraging

evidence that the potential recruitment challenges the UTC faces can be addressed and that the UTC will enhance parental and learner options in the area.
