Thank you for your email of 22 October 2015 requesting the following information:

"Please provide the build date of all housing constructed in Plymouth for the Ministry of Defense since the year 1900. Please also provide the construction method used for each house, if available."

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

The majority of the information you have requested can be found in the table below.

Please note that there is an additional total of 85 properties for which no exact build data is held. The buildings have been built during the period of 1900-2015 but unfortunately, we cannot provide any further information.

Regarding the second part of your request, I'm afraid that we do not hold the construction methods used for each house.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that should you provide a specific property we may be able to provide further information regarding construction methods.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact DIO Secretariat in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
