FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: KNIFE CRIME

We refer to your email dated 20 September 2016 which was acknowledged on 21 September 2016.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email of the 20 September 2016 you requested the following information:

"Under the Freedom of Information Act, I would like to know, of all the incidents involving a knife or sharp instrument that you recorded (in the time frames below), how many:

- led to arrest (one or multiple)
- led to charges being made (to one person or multiple people)
- led to no action being taken went unsolved

The time frames I would this information for are:

September 2015 - August 2016 September 2014 - August 2015 September 2013 - August 2014

Please could you could send me the percentage as well as the figures."

A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held.

Please could you could send me the percentage as well as the figures.

No Information held. The Ministry of Defence Police (MDP) does not record percentages.

If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 2nd Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, London SW1A 2HB (email CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate the case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
