

HS2 Cycle Route - network linking communities within the HS2 corridor. It is made up of local links between local conventional stations and new HS2 stations through settlements to high streets, schools and new housing developments in the corridor.

- Royal Dutch Haskoning are carrying out this study which was announced by Prime Minister in August 2013. It is part of a vision to increase cycling in England through provision of world class cycle infrastructure to broaden the appeal of cycling as a viable transport option for local journeys. The study will be completed in October and Ministers will take a view on next steps by the end of the year.
- The study is being carried out in two stages:
 - Stage 1 (2014) 7 workshops with local highway authorities and national bodies to identify priority enhancements to improve local cycle networks and options to create a linear route with satellittes.
 - Stage 2 (Jan to Oct 2015) Cost assessment, outline business case and further dialogue with local highway authorities and national bodies to refine route and identify any possible interfaces with HS2, and consider governance and any approach to land assembly (outside of the HS2 hybrid bill process)
- The study aims for a 10 year plus investment programme of high quality visible and safe links into and out of over 200 settlements built to Dutch cycle standards
- Creation of a national North-South leisure and uility cycleway by joining local links using a combination of canals, upgraded rights of way, old railways or field edge boundaries.
- Cycle rail integration by linking to 70 rail stations and all new HS2 stations
