Dear ,

Thank you for your email of 30<sup>th</sup> September 2015 requesting the following information:

Please could you provide me with a Complete list of FV Numbers (both in service and out of service vehicles) and what vehicle they are

for example

FV107: Scimitar Light tank with 30 mm Rarden Cannon

FV4034: Challenger 2

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held and is attached at Annex A.

Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that FV (Fighting Vehicle) numbers are an historic reference allocated to equipment and parts, often referring to a drawing number created within the War Office/Ministry of Defence (MOD). This methodology of identification is no longer employed within the MOD and we do not maintain a consolidated list, current or historic, of FV Numbers. However, interrogation of MOD information systems has highlighted a list of FV numbers relating to parts not vehicles.

There are also a number of open sources that contain some of the requested information.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
