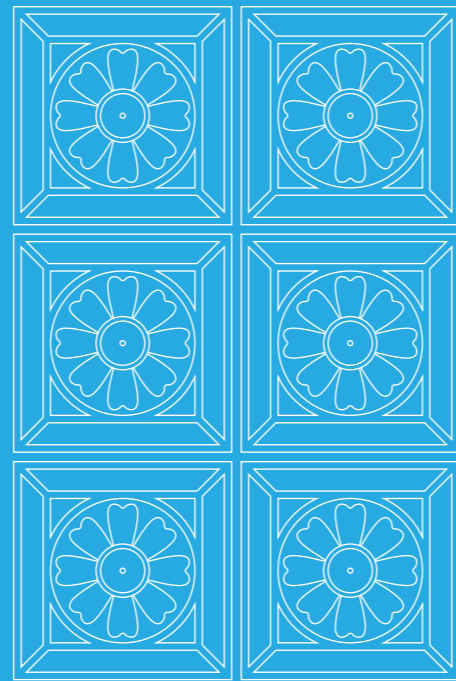


It's time for Euston

Euston was London's first inter-city station. It's been at the heart of Britain's transport system ever since.

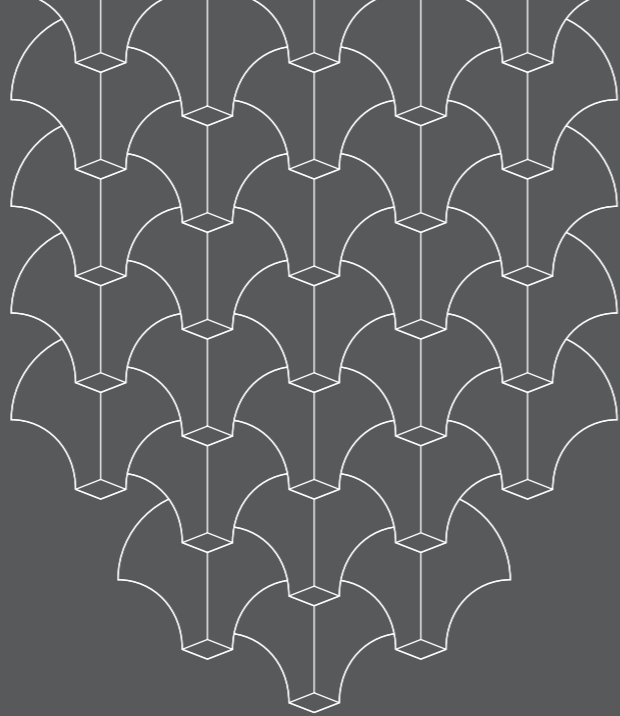

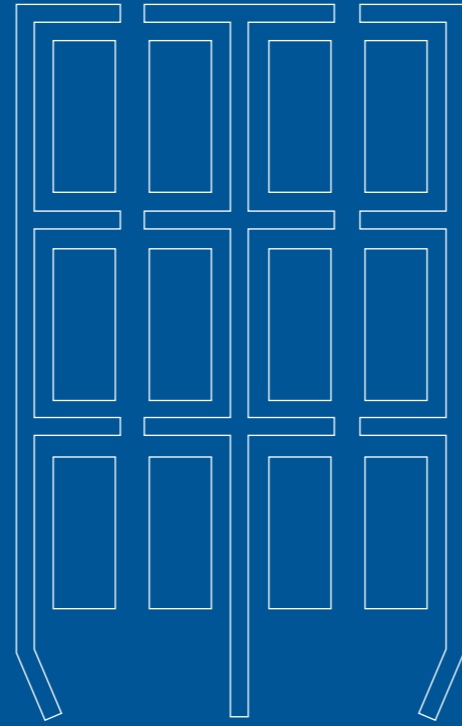


But as demand for rail travel grows, Euston is becoming increasingly overcrowded.



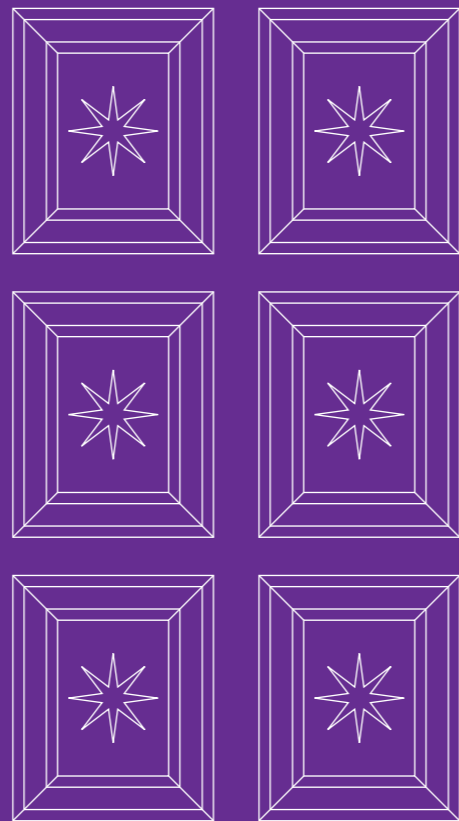

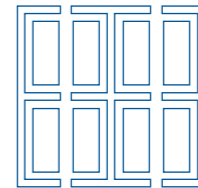
The redesigned station will make travelling through Euston easier for everyone.



Euston was London's first inter-city station. Today, it serves over 40 million passengers a year: more than twice the number for which it was designed. Demand for rail travel continues to grow. We need fast, new services between major cities, and more reliable, less crowded services on routes we already use.

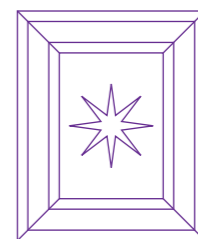


Euston has had upgrades in the past: most significantly in 1968, when the current station was built. But the arrival of High Speed Two is an opportunity to transform the service that Euston can provide, so it continues its historic role as a gateway between London and much of the rest of the country.



We will add 11 platforms for high speed trains, to treble the seats available for passengers travelling from Euston at peak times.

A redeveloped and expanded Underground connection will include direct links to the Circle, Hammersmith & City, and Metropolitan lines.



We will modernise and extend the station in stages, so that people can keep making their usual journeys. Once the bigger station is complete, its world-class design, access and facilities will make travelling easier for everyone, even if they never take a high speed train.
