I am writing regarding your request for information, received on 19 January 2015. In that request, you asked us for the following information:

- 1. The annual number of canine fatalities handled by the Highways Agency and its contractors since the year 2000 when the mandatory policy started.
- 2. The annual numbers of canine fatalities in that period which were handled according to the guidelines (the paragraph at the end of 7.17 provides some leeway).

We have estimated that the cost of compiling information relating to these two questions will exceed £600. Section 12 of the Act does not oblige us to comply with requests if they exceed this limit.

We are unable to provide figures for the annual numbers of canine fatalities as this information is not held centrally and would be difficult to extract from any logs that are kept by the various contractors. Please also be aware that some of this information is no longer held by the Agency due to the many changes of contractor over the past 15 years.

We have, however, previously published a response to a similar Freedom of Information request for dog and cat deaths numbers from 1 September 2012 to 10 September 2014: https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/animal-deaths

3. This may be more difficult, but some indication of the costs of handling a fatality (a monetary value would be good, but failing that an indication of operative time would be useful).

This information is not held centrally. The Agency's maintenance contracts are structured so that its managing agents are paid a "lump sum" for a wide range of general maintenance duties. These include dead animal removal duties. We do not disaggregate this "lump sum" budget and spend on these particular types of activities, so animal removal costs cannot be extracted.
