Surrender

We have decided to accept the surrender of the permit for Bio-UK Fuels (Sheffield) operated by Bio-UK Fuels (Sheffield) Limited.

The permit number is EPR/QP3632GJ.

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to avoid any pollution risk and to return the site to a satisfactory state.

We consider in reaching that decision we have taken into account all relevant considerations and legal requirements.

The site is a low impact installation (LII). Processing equipment, storage bunds and all associated waste and raw materials have been removed from the site to new operating premises. Four small plastic drums remaining have been removed by an appropriate contractor for disposal (refer to Picture 3).

Work was ongoing by the operator to redecorate the Unit (Pictures 1 and 2) in order to hand it back to the Landlord who is requesting a copy of the surrender documentation before handover. The Unit was in a satisfactory state to allow the permit surrender to be progressed.
